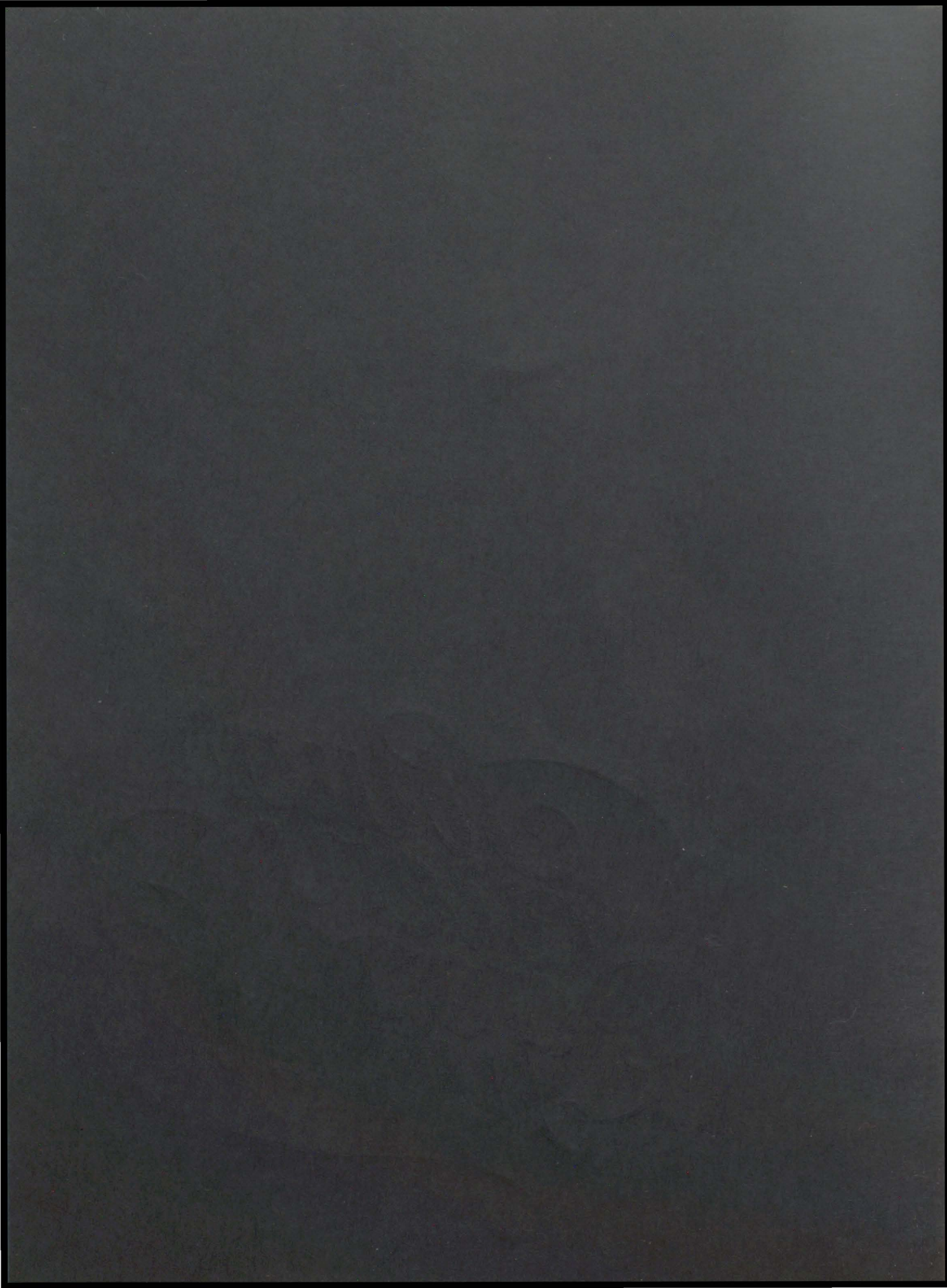

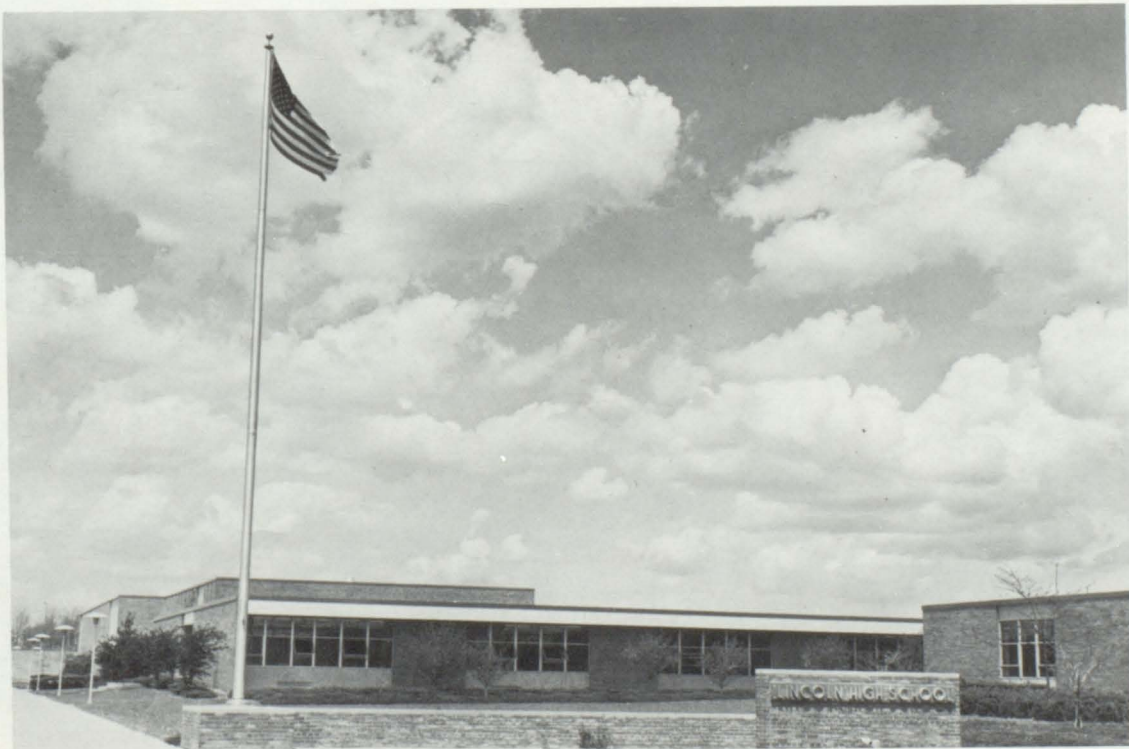

Dedication

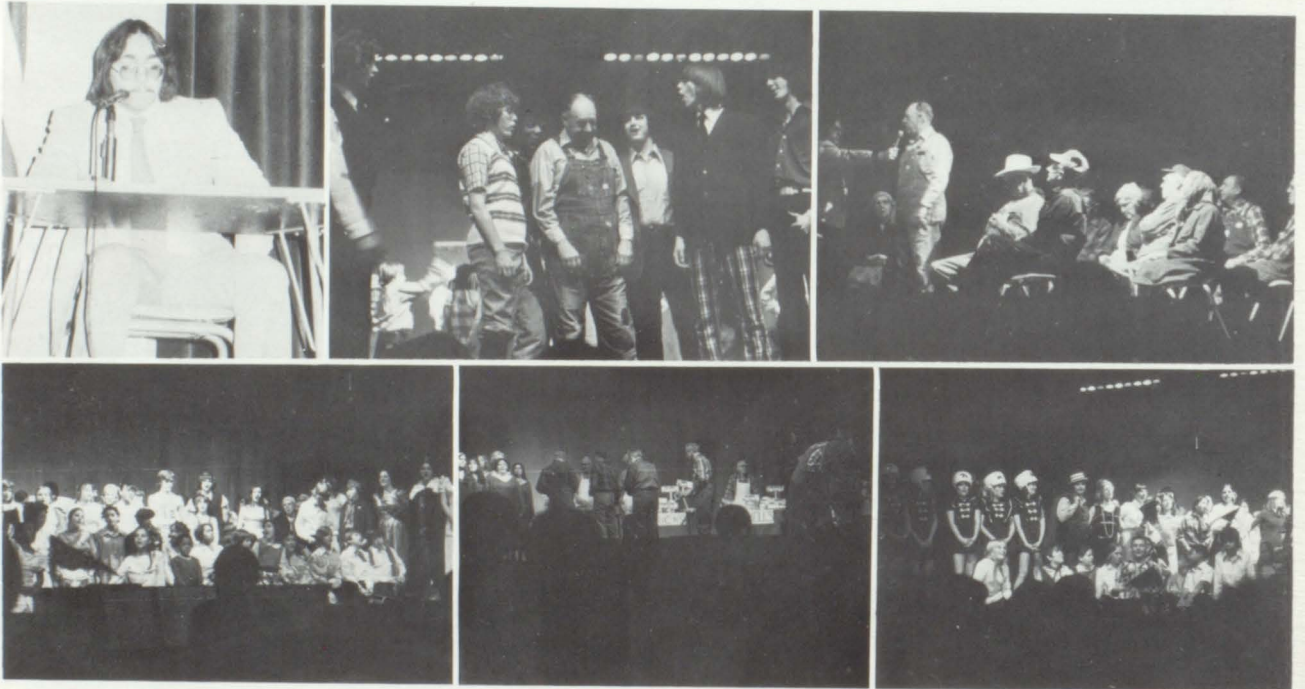
