In Pennsylvania, the two learn a sad fact: He's been home for 8 years now, and he still hasn't proposed to Andrea. Too bad, Andrea.

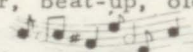
But the next revelation is a happy one: The sure way to success on the road was to marry her driving instructor, but Brenda still hasn't learned to drive.

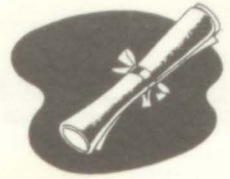
