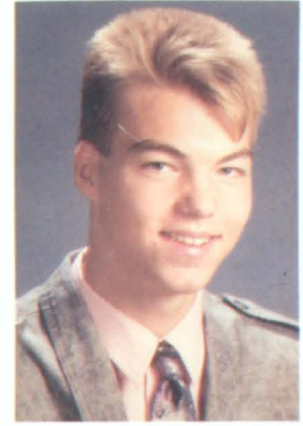
The Road Not Taken

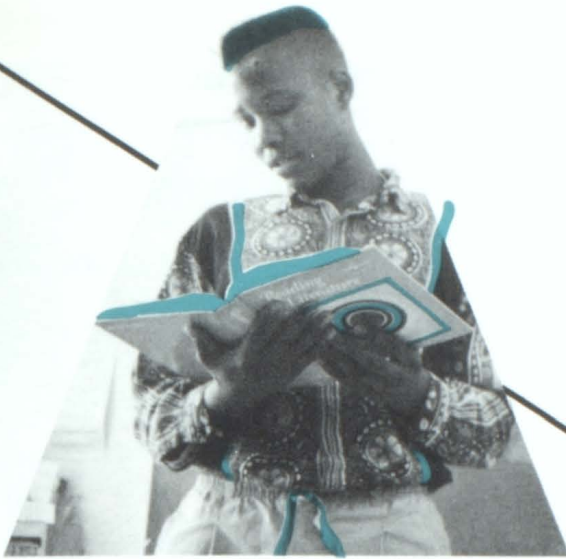

Local Businesses and private patrons make RIF possible. Their contributions, combined with government funds, pay the \$10,000 that RIF costs.

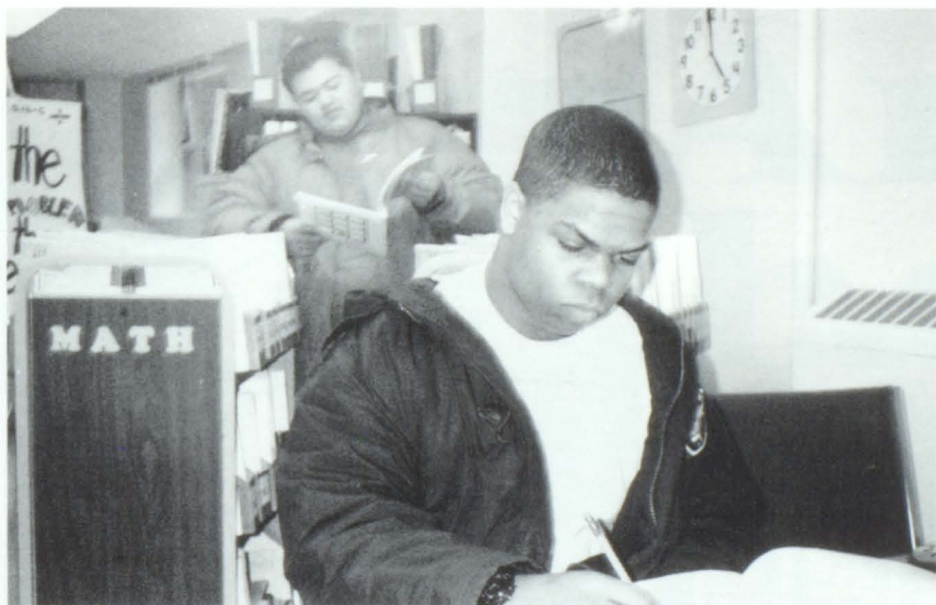
Approximately 830 students participate by visiting the library three times each year to choose a new book, averaging \$6.00 or more per book.

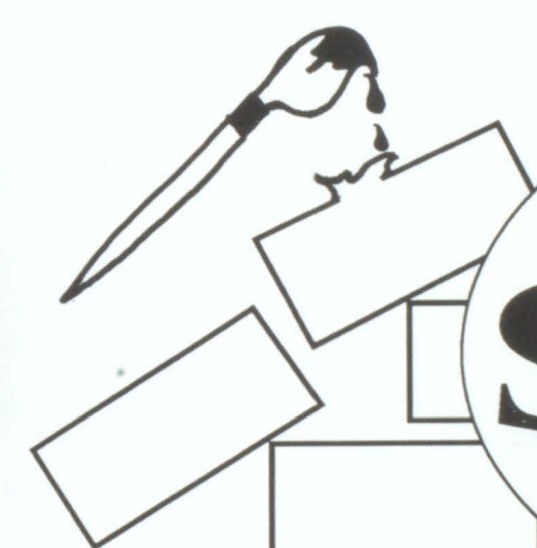
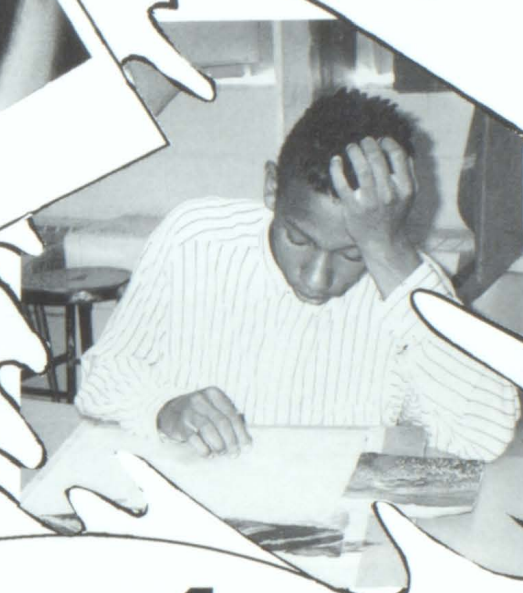
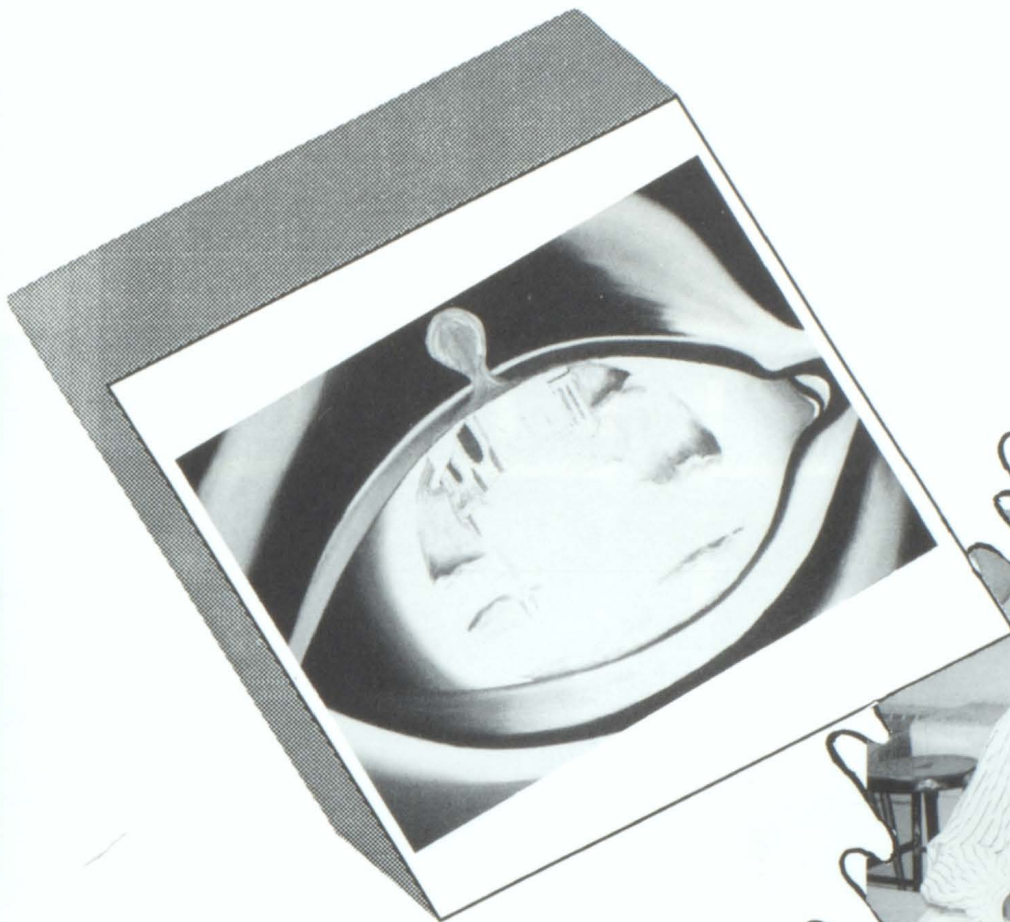

This year the 1992 Lincoln Art show displayed over 900 pieces of art work by elementary, middle and high schools. These art exhibits continue to improve every year.



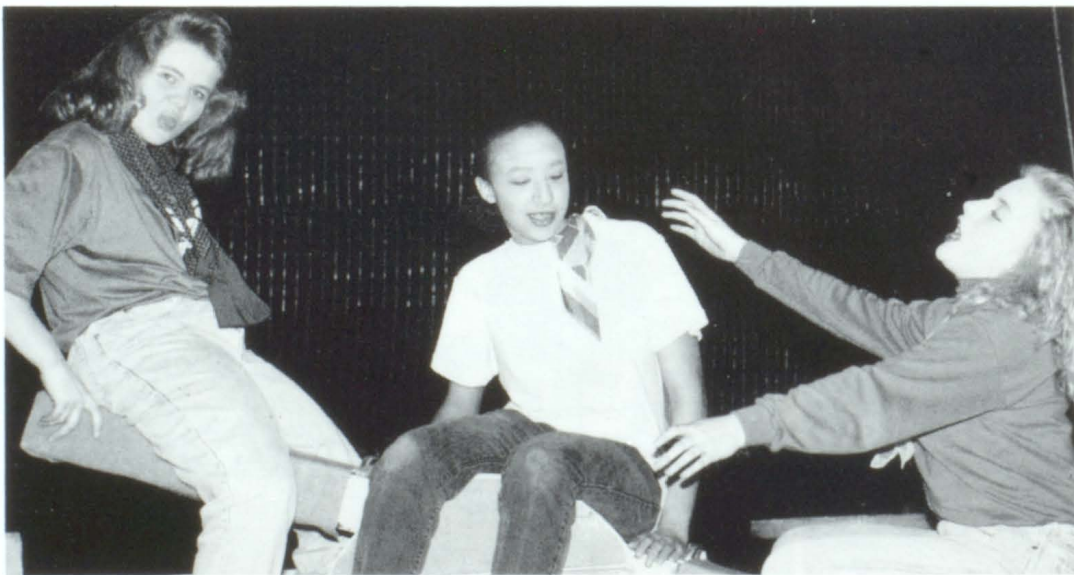

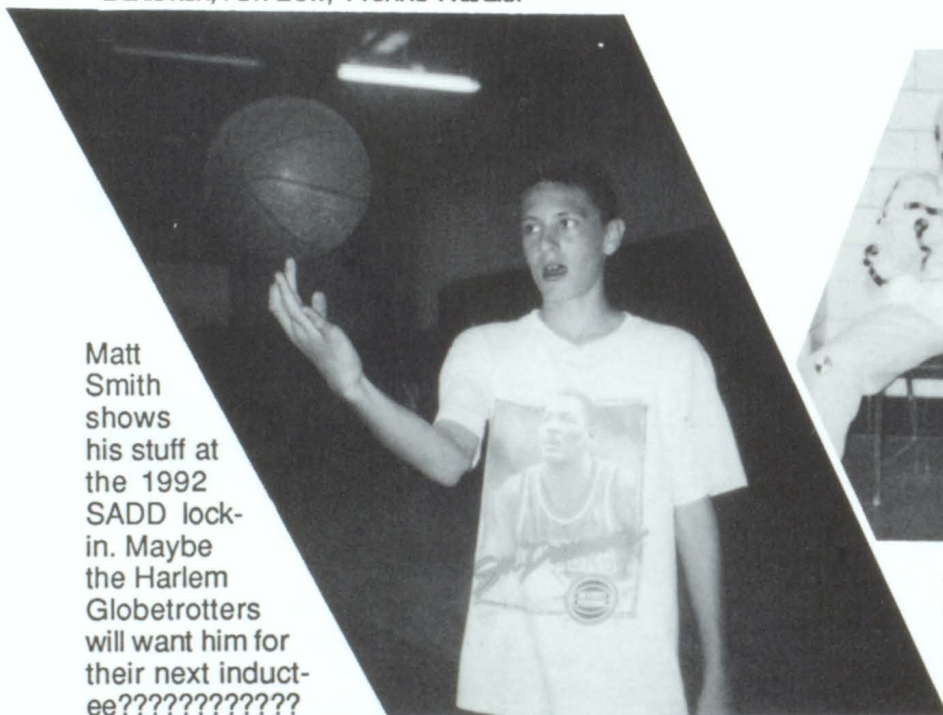

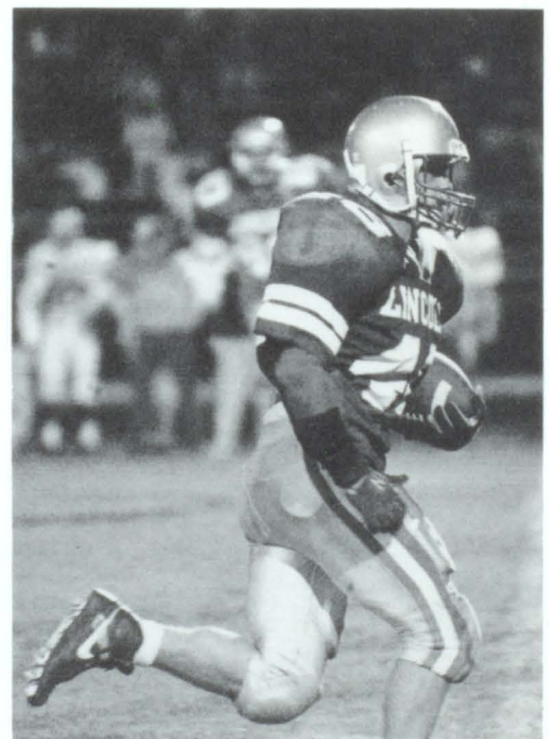

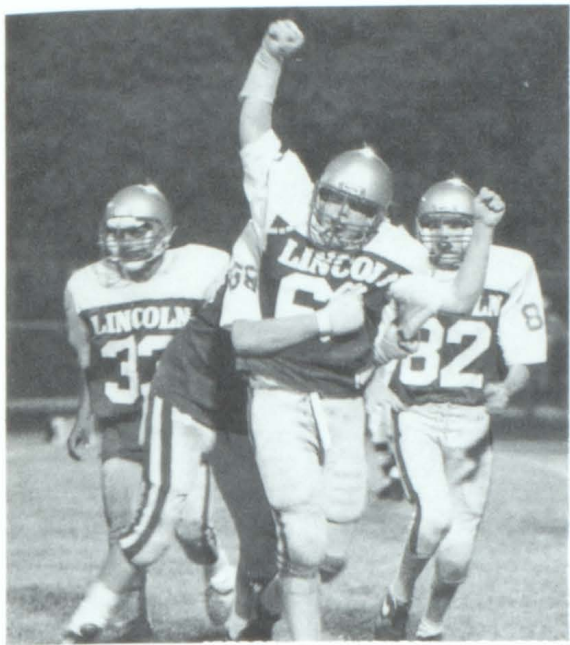

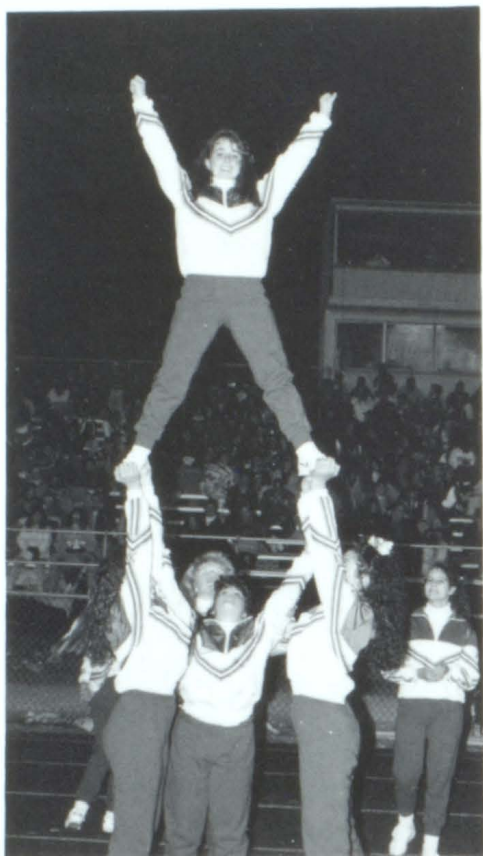

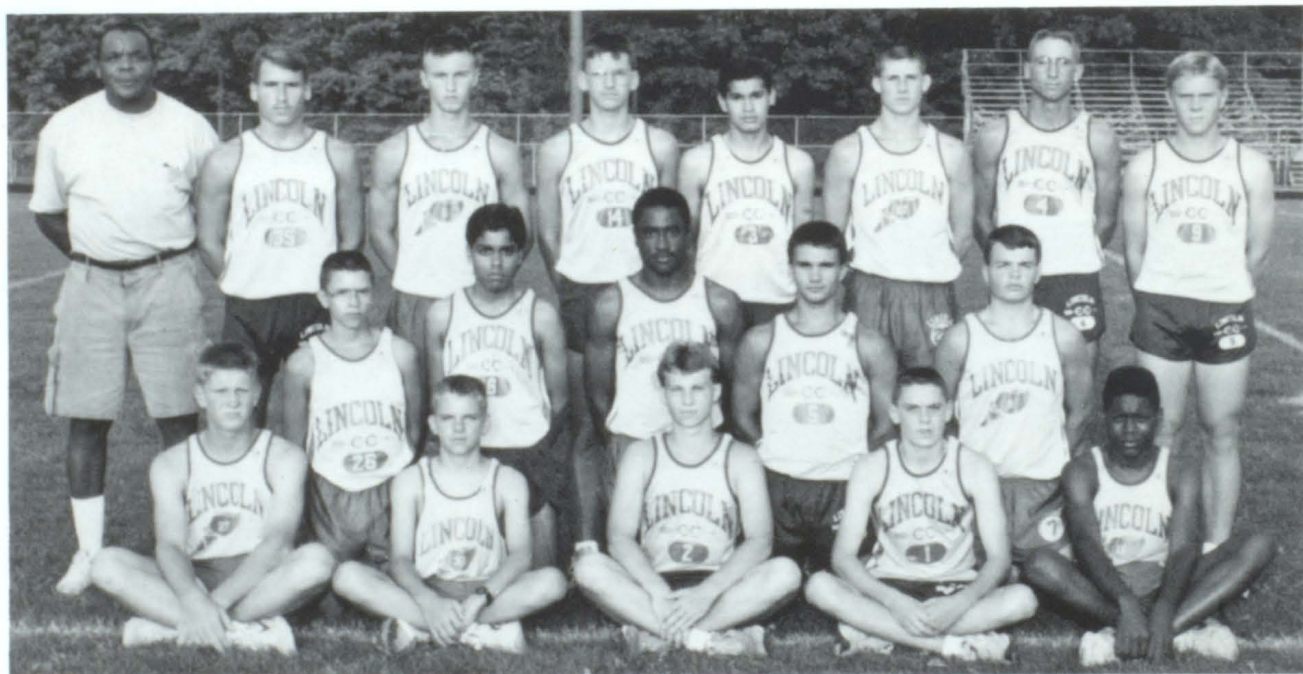

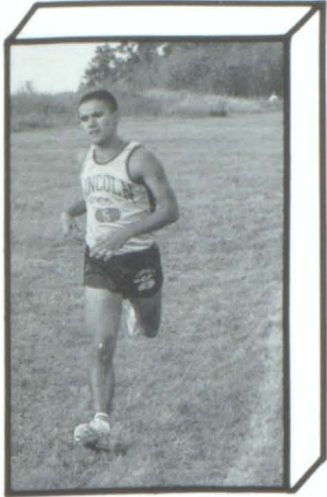

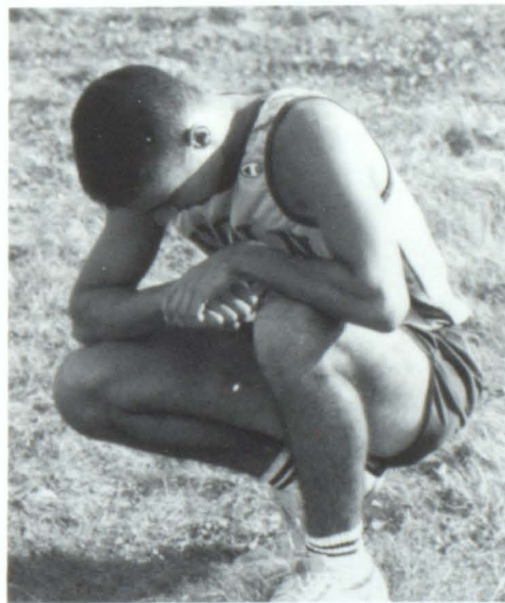

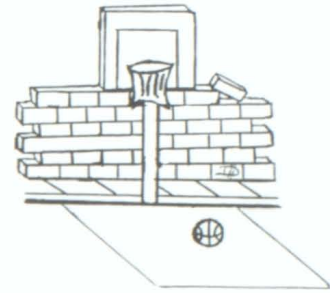

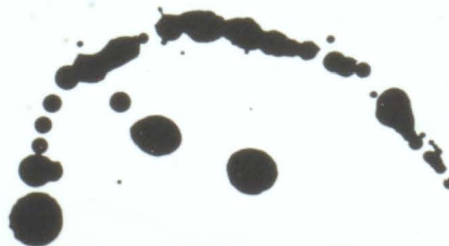

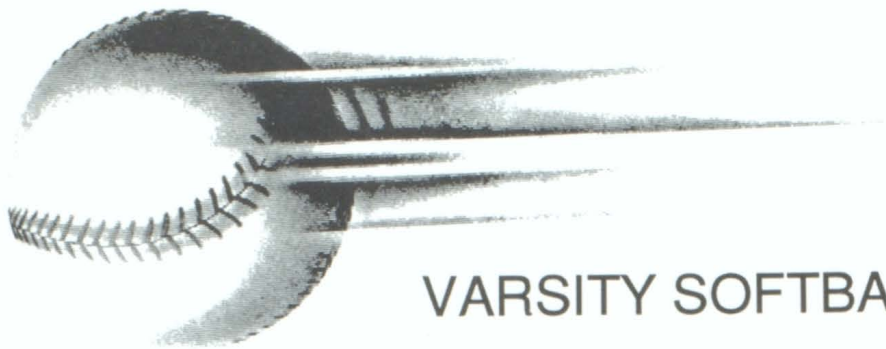

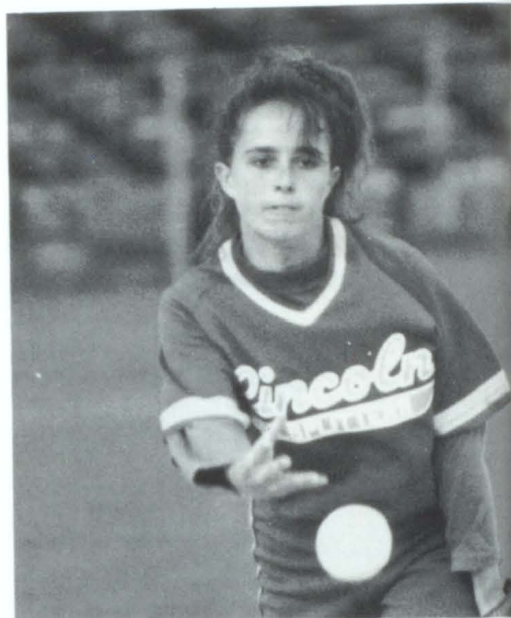

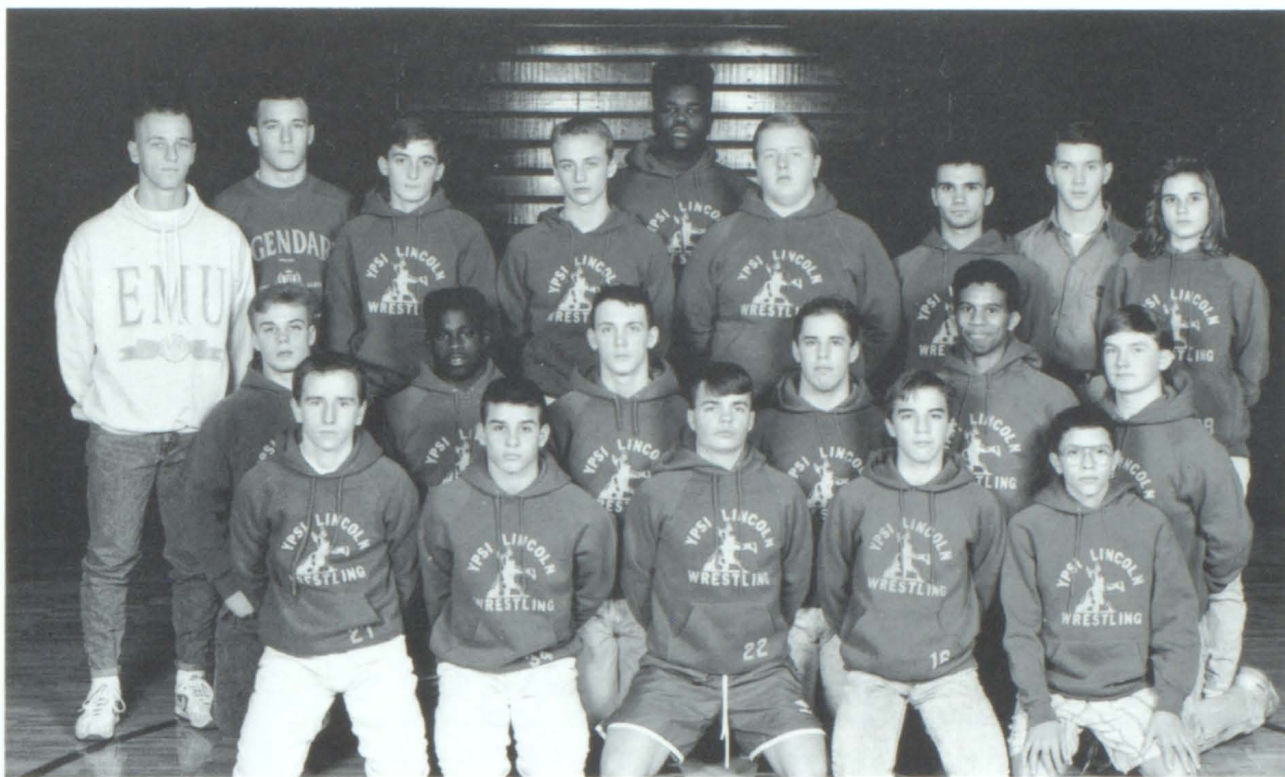

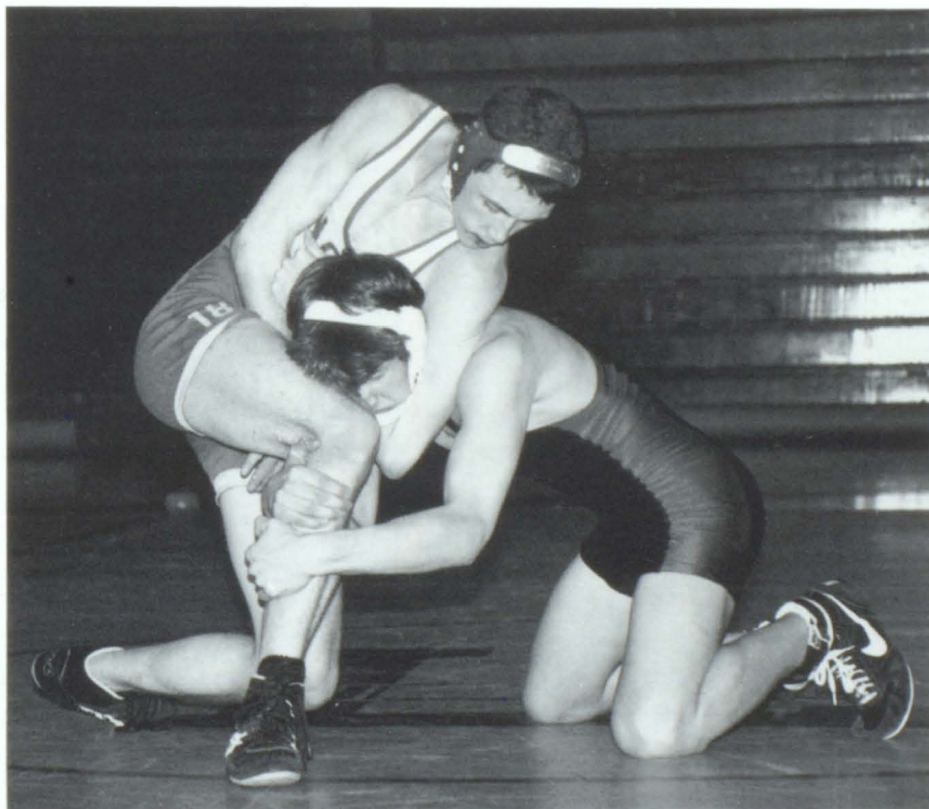

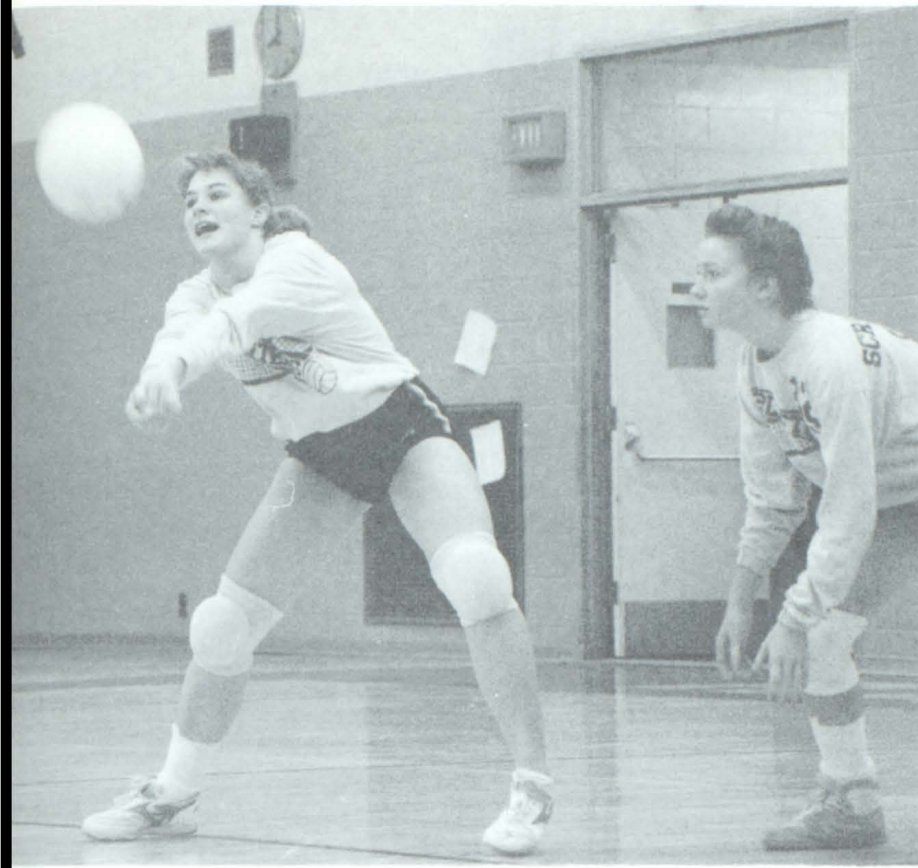

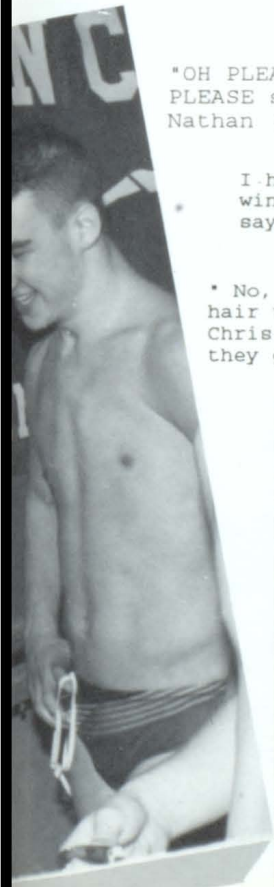
