## Chapter 3 THE BEGINNINGS IN THE UNITED STATES

The roots of American government reach deep into the past. The system of government that we know today grew from the ideas of the men who first came to the New World. Some political thinkers of that time were so far ahead of their age that they were called "fathers of the Republic."

### The Colonial Period

Our English Heritage. The French, Spanish, Dutch, Norwegian, and other Europeans settled in parts of what was to become the United States. But it was the English who came to the largest numbers. And it was the English who were to control the thirteen colonies that stretched for 3,000 miles along the Atlantic seaboard.

These early pioneers who cleared the wilderness and brought all the best and most advanced ideas of the future to the New World, were not content here in search of a quiet life.

Forming Fathers of Independence. The men of 1776, the "fathers of the Republic," were men of great courage and vision. They had learned from the experience of England that a government should be based on the consent of the governed. They had seen that a government should be limited in its powers and should be responsible to the people. They had seen that a government should be organized so that the interests of all the people would be protected. They had seen that a government should be able to defend the rights of the people and to maintain order and justice. (1) *The Value of the Concept of Limited Government and of Self-Limitation.* They brought with them, too, the twin ideas of limited government and self-limitation. That is, that government is limited in what it may do, and, conversely, that it is limited in the sense

that each man has certain rights that government cannot injure or take away. These great principles of freedom were proclaimed in such historic English documents as the Magna Carta in 1215, the Petition of Right in 1628, and the Bill of Rights and the Act of Toleration of 1689.

(2) *The Concept of Representative Government.* A third vitally important concept brought to America by English ships was that of representative government. For centuries there had been developing in England the
