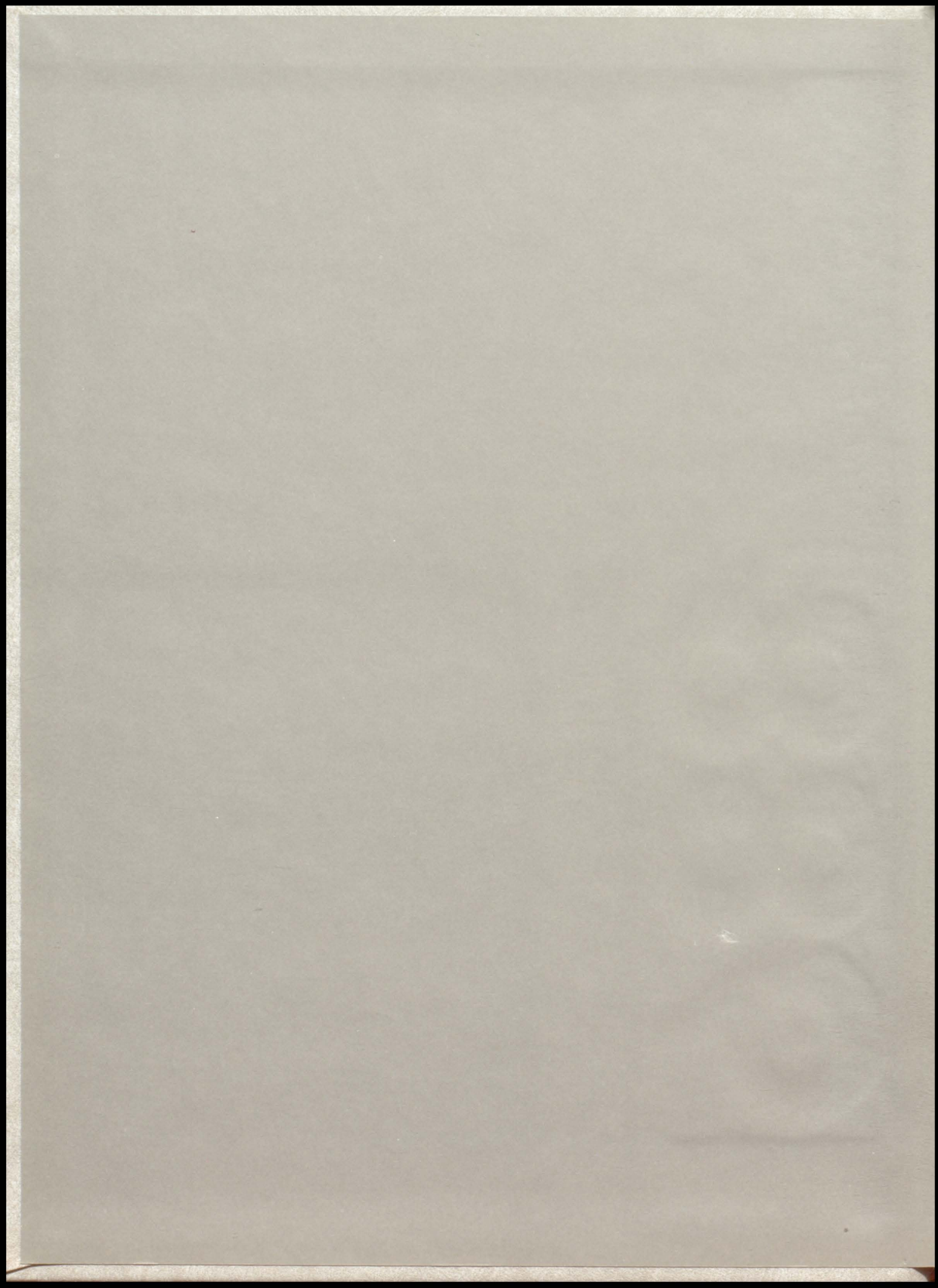

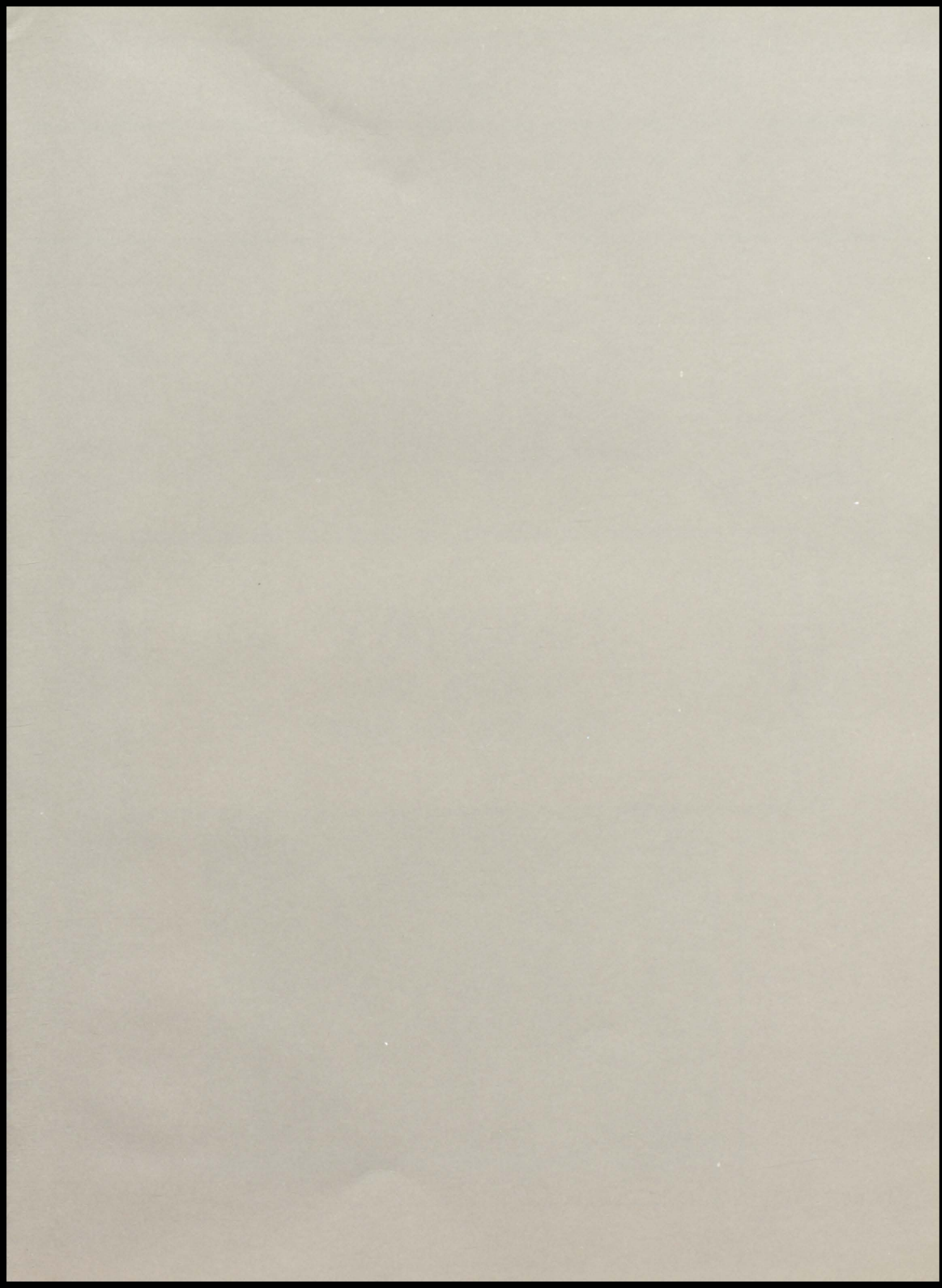

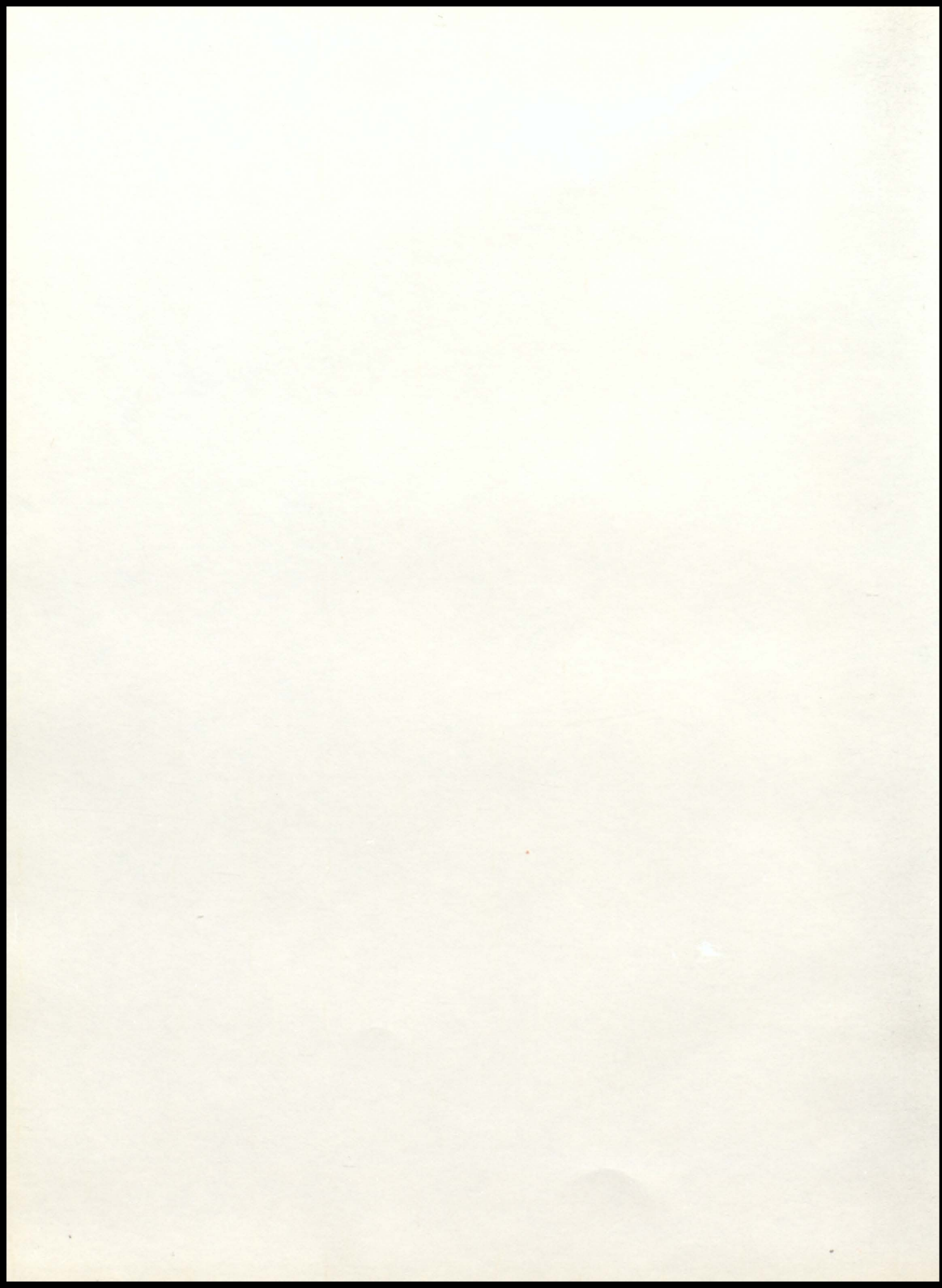

As sophomores we have taken a step in the right direction, learning and growing, experiencing all of the fun that comes with being in high school.

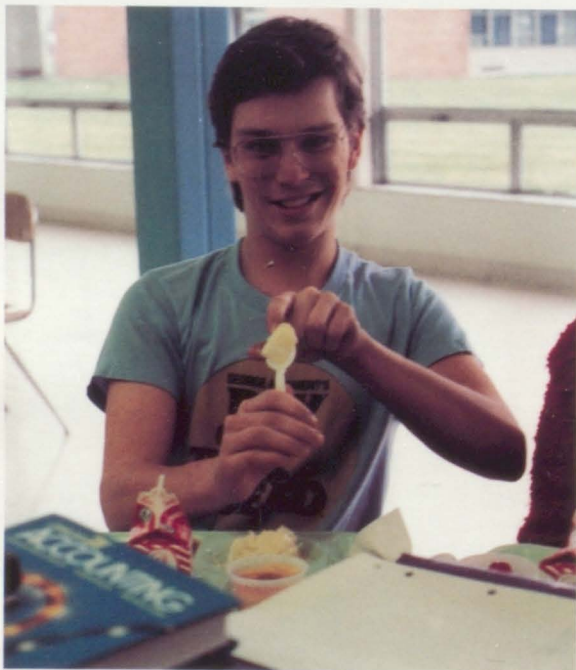
As juniors we are one step closer to being the best we can be, feeling the triumphs and tragedies everyone faces.

A friend to me you'll always be.



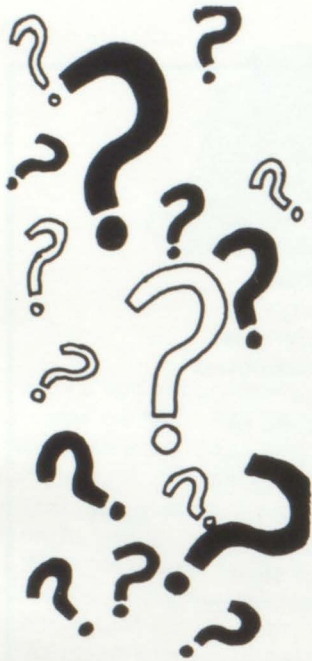

### The Rock Saga

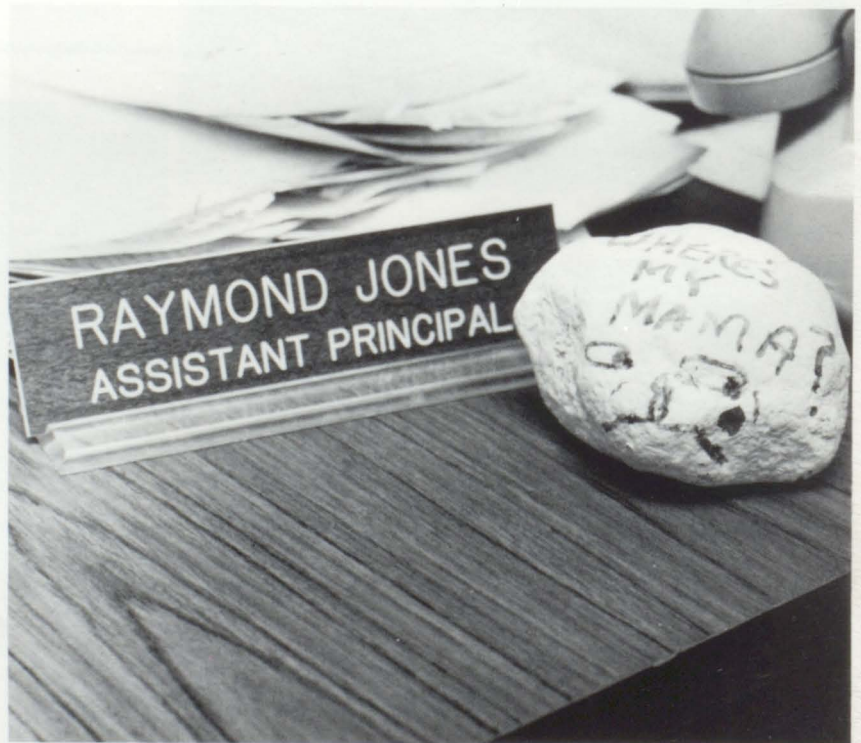


It's gone!

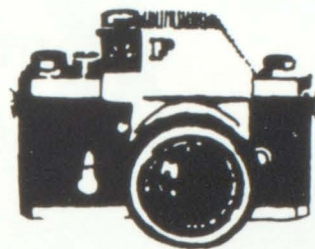

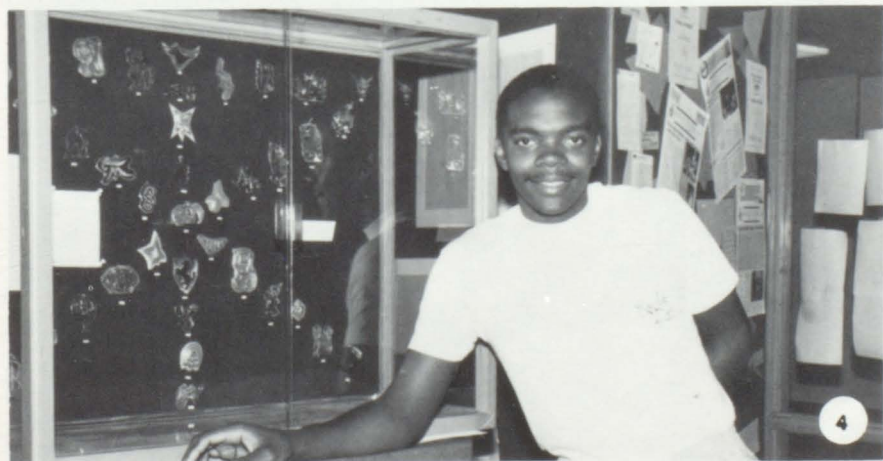

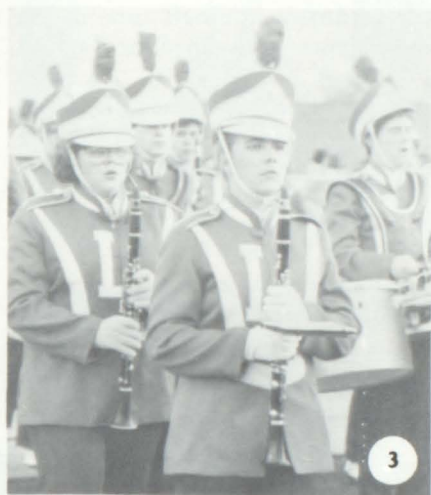

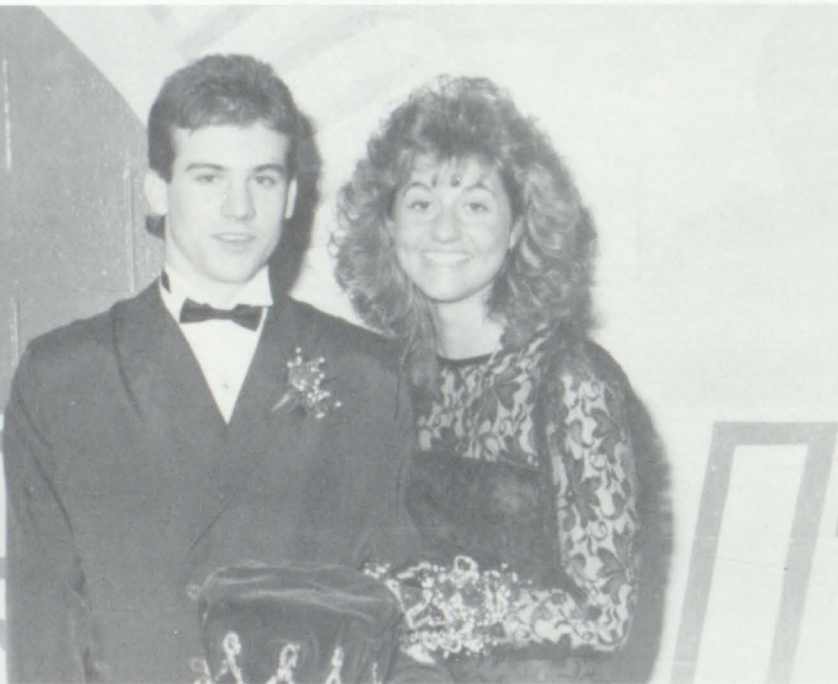
# The Guys' Turn To Shine

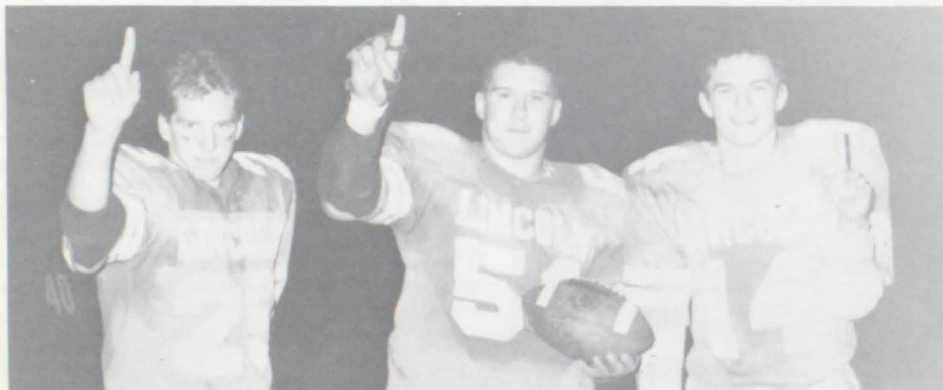

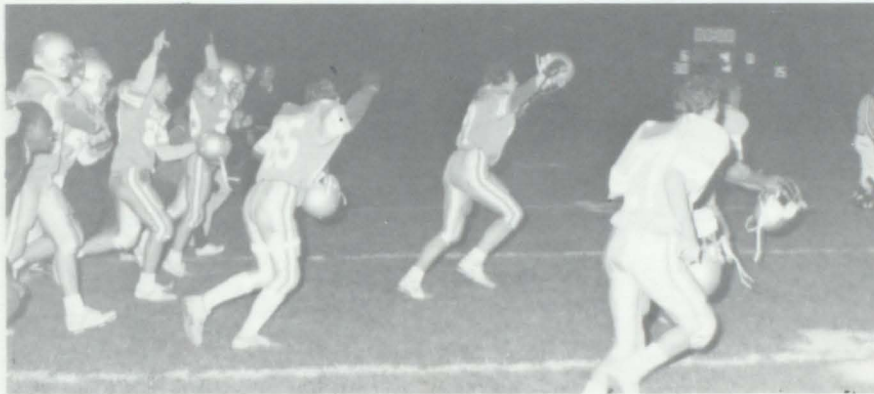

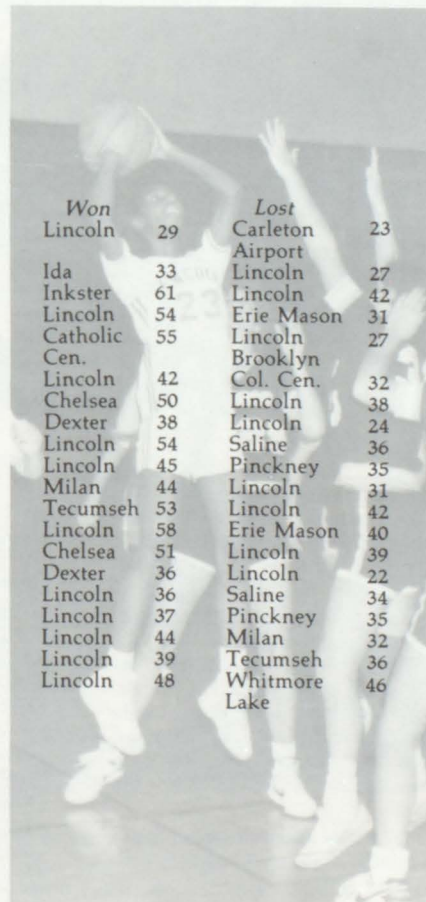

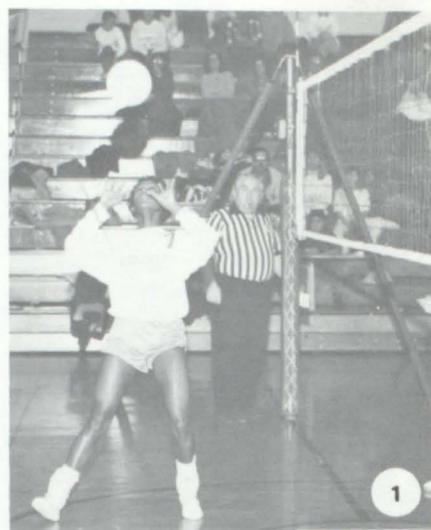

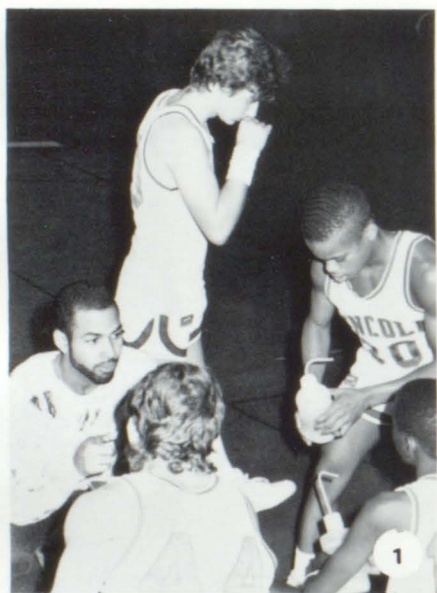

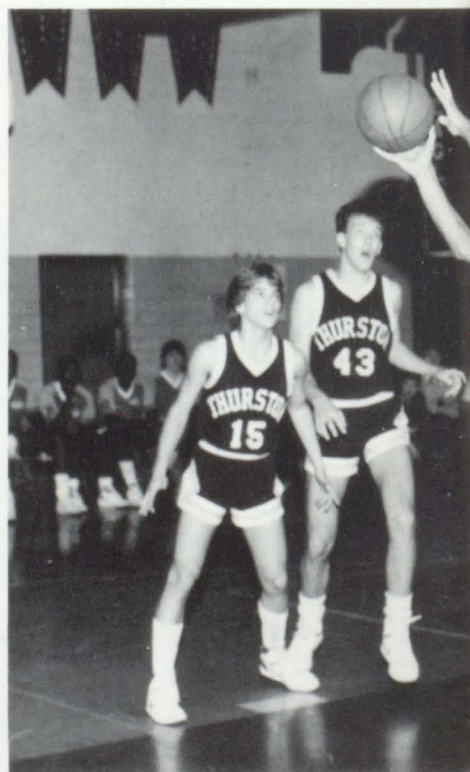

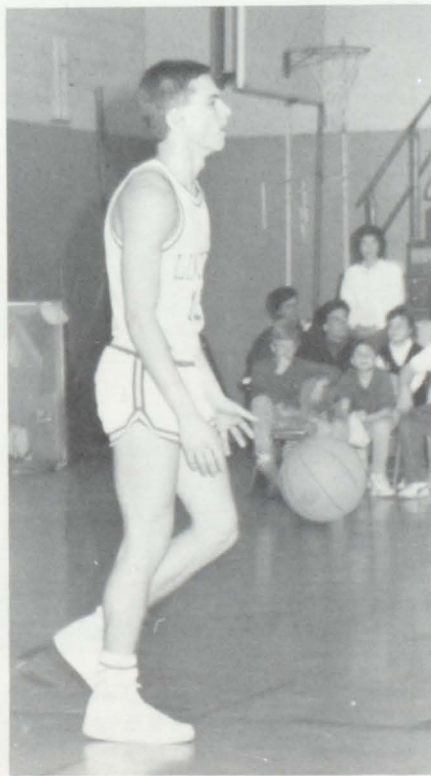

In addition, several players were named to the SEC all-league teams: Senior Joe Blust made the first team, while Shawn Alliston and senior Dan Hall were named to the second team.

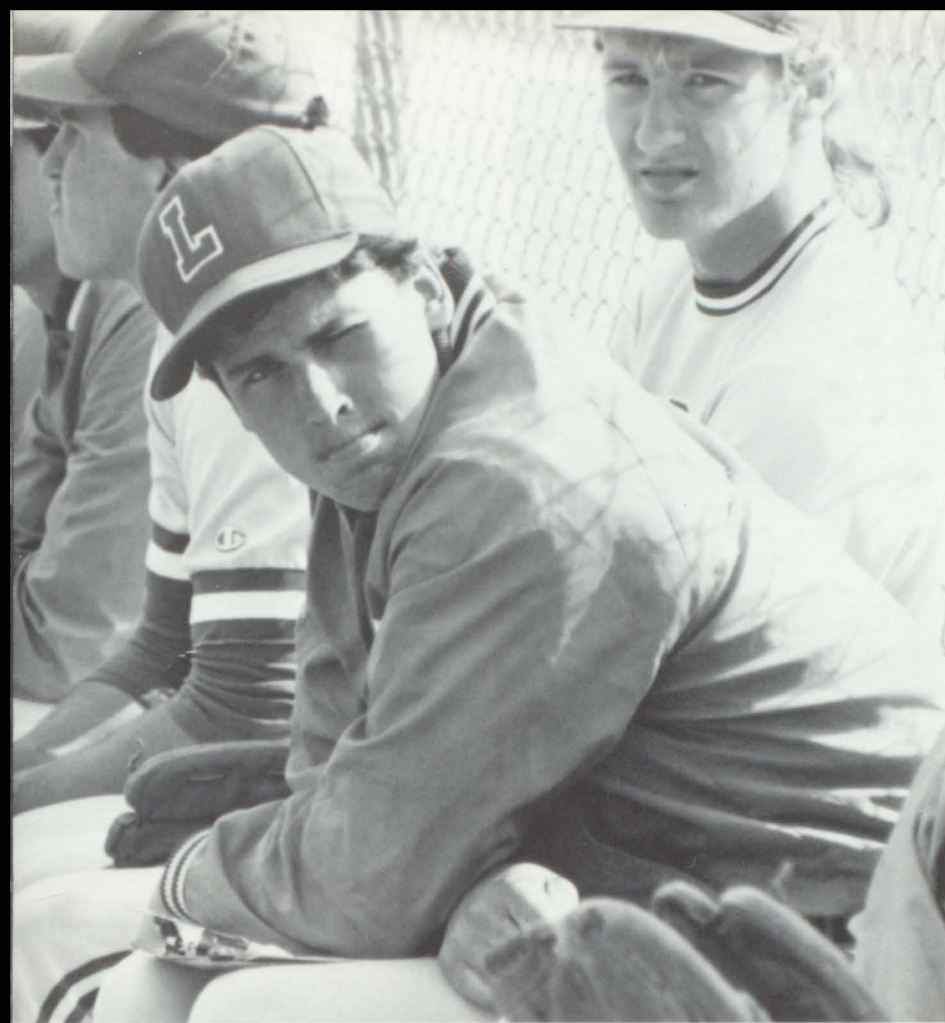

Let's hope that, 50 years from now, the classmates of 1988 can get together again and maybe even have the chance to reminisce with the class of 2038.



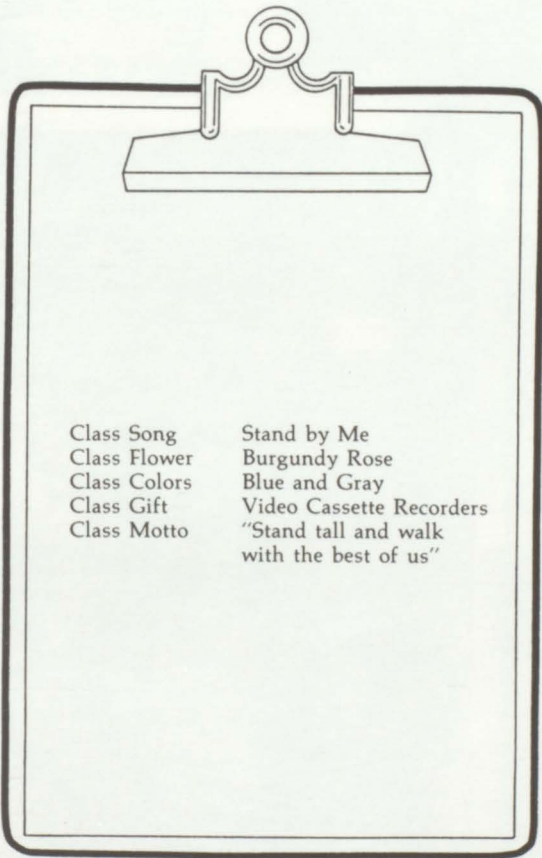

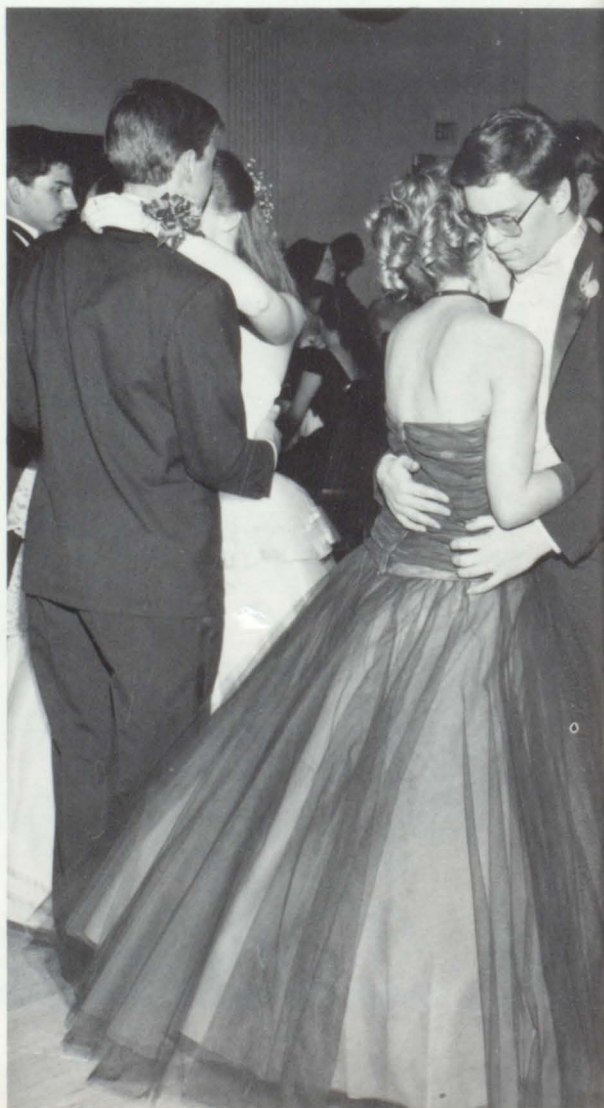
# Moonlight Masquerade
